

BIBLE ACADEMY COURSES

1004 – Effective Bible Reading

This course identifies the appropriate methods, approaches and other suggestions on how to read the Bible for Spiritual growth and Christian maturity. Areas that will be covered include structure of the Bible, resources for study, literacy styles, etc.
